If you have been following our live stories on Facebook, you would have seen the beautiful leopard spotted in camp, under the walkway right by our Ndebele Villa with his kill high up in a tree in the lodge garden.

Other fantastic sightings include a pack of wild dog having a rest, Cape glossy starlings, grey go-away birds and of course, warthogs - although this time not on our lawn but at Malembeni Pan where our Photographic Bunker, iTumbela is situated.
