# Wildlife Update

This month we have been treated to some amazing bird sightings. From an immature martial eagle to a pearl spotted owlet and vultures, we were delighted to have such a good birding month.

#### Conservation Status

It is not often that you spot a southern ground hornbill, the largest species of hornbill worldwide. These magnificent and unique birds are classified as vulnerable due to habitat loss; there are only around 1500 left in the wild in South Africa! Their numbers have been declining, due in part to persecution, habitat destruction, cultural beliefs, and other factors. Several projects are being undertaken to conserve and protect the status of this species. It was a real treat to see this one in the Klaserie recently strutting it's stuff.
