Alvis Drift Wine





On occasions, we at Makumu invite boutique winemakers to the lodge and host impromptu wine tasting dinners for our guests. This is a fun and interactive way to try out new vintages all whilst spending the evening sipping on a glass of red or white and watching the sun set over the bush.

<u>Alvi's Drift</u> was one of our most recent guests, a family-owned business with 4 generations making up the family-run farm. Interestingly, Alvi's Drift is not only a wine farm but a dairy farm as well! Every day 2,000 cows are milked which is used to produce butter, cream, and cheese. They produce a total of 12 tonnes of cheese daily and handle 150,000 litres of milk every day!

Alvi's Drift is also home to 200,000 chickens and 1,000 pigs. Food is planted for cows and other animals in another farm department, run by owner Alvi's brother. Alvi takes care of the rest; 100 hectares of citrus, mostly mandarins, lemons, oranges, 50 hectares of yellow peaches and apricots and 450 hectares under vines.

For many years, Alvi's grandfather, Alvi van der Merwe, and his father, Bertie, produced wine in bulk. They sold all the wine to the merchants, never bottling their own wine. In 2002, Alvi came back to the farm after practicing medicine for 18 years and decided to produce his own wine. In the past year, he produced a wooded Chardonnay for which he won a gold medal!

Wild dogs:

We have been extremely lucky to have had a couple of wild dog sightings on different occasions this month.

Lion:

Makumu's lion sightings never disappoint as we have the big River pride that hangs around in the Klaserie. The small cubs are starting to grow as well. A real treat this month was a sighting of a new nomadic group we have not seen before. 3 young males and 1 female was found relaxing at ours truly, Malembeni.

Leopard:

Leopard sightings have really been booming this month at Makumu. On a few game drives our guests were even that lucky to have seen two different leopard sightings in one drive. The definite highlight of course would be the leopard cubs with their mother Manzi.

Hyena:

Our local pregnant hyena finally had her cubs. And even better, their den is right by our beautiful Malembeni waterhole. The cubs are still a bit skittish as they tend to run back to their den as soon as a vehicle approaches. But some of our guests were lucky enough to watch the cubs come out of their den, playing, and running around.

Elephant:

There is quite a lot of elephant herds at the moment and they have been quite busy around Makumu and inside the camp. We get big herds moving through our camp which always excites our guests!
